GOING : GOOD; GOOD TO FIRM

Before the start of racing, a number of trainers expressed concern at the noise the Jubilee flags & bunting were making. It was therefore agreed that any horses who seemed nervous in the parade ring would be allowed to go to post early & that any offending bunting be removed near the parade ring.

Mr A. Le Brocq, trainer of **FINE THE WORLD**, running in the first, and **ANNA GALERIA** running in the third, requested that his horses be led in at the start if needed. The Starter was present and agreed.

The Stewards informed Mrs. A Malzard trainer of **GRENAME** that the blood test results requested at the previous meeting had returned negative for prohibitive substances.

After the running of the first race the Steward immediately called an enquiry into **FINE THE WORLD** and its refusal to start. The Starter confirmed that the mount had come under orders but had refused to jump off, therefore Rule 4 did not apply and the result stood. Mr. A. Le Brocq the trainer of the horse was then interviewed, he reported that the horse was quirky and on this occasion had let him, the owner and all backers down.

Following the running of the second race the Stewards interviewed Mr. F. Tett the jockey of **RUNAROUND RITA** following its withdrawal. He reported that the horse had worked well on course on a prior occasion and in his opinion his ride had suffered 'stage fright'. Mrs. J. Le Brocq the trainer when interviewed agreed with this. Whilst Rule 4 applied the horse was priced at 20/1 and no deductions were required. The Medical Officer reported that Mr. Tett was fit after a routine examination following his unseating.

ANNA GALERIA having unseated the jockey Mr. T. Clark was withdrawn having completed two circuits of the course and eventually coming to a halt in the trainers holding area. The jockey reported the horse had slipped unseating him and had then bolted. The jockey was order to report to the Medical Officers for a routine examination, they later reported that they had passed him fit. The Veterinary Officer reported that horse was unharmed by its adventure. Rule 4 applied with a 10p deduction on all bets placed before the new book had been built.

Before the running of the fifth race Mr. J Mercier requested that **CRONKYVODDY** be led in at the start, the Stewards agreed as long as the Starter was consulted and agreed.
