Non Runner - GARDEN PARTY - Not allowed to travel due to adverse weather conditions

Before the start of racing; Mrs A. Corson, trainer of **REBEL WOMAN**, running in the second, requested that the horse be allowed to go to post early if it appeared nervous in the Parade Ring. Mr A. Le Brocq, trainer of **FINE THE WORLD**, running in the first, requested that the horse be led in at the start if needed. Mrs. C. Gilbert, trainer of **MAJOR MAXIMUS**, running in the fifth race, requested that the horse be allowed to be mounted in the chute if the horse was nervous in the Parade Ring. In all cases permission was granted

Following the running of the first race the Stewards interviewed Mr. J.S.O. Arthur about the tardy appearance of one of his mounts in the Parade Ring, Mr. Arthur explained that the horse had managed to bend a pin in its tack which had to be attended to. The Stewards noted his explanation.

For the running of the third race the Stewards of the day were joined by Mr. Simon Vivian.

Following the running of the third race the Stewards interviewed Mrs. A. Corson as to the improvement in form of **KING KENNY**. The trainer explained that the horse was racing on level weights on this occasion, as well the weather conditions being a touch kinder than last time out. Mrs. Corson further reported that the horse had under gone a blood test at home following its last run and that had come back with nothing untoward. The Stewards noted her explanation and took no further action.

Mr. Vivan was thanked for his time and took no further role that afternoon.

The Stewards interviewed Mr. J.S.O. Arthur after the running of the fourth as to the behaviour of **ATHANIA** at the start. The Stewards noted that the horse had played up at the start last season in July, Mr. Arthur could not offer an immediate answer to the horses behaviour save that he would try his charge at a different distance next time out, as there was no problem when **ATHANIA** started on the home straight. The Stewards noted this explanation.

Mrs. A. Malzard was called before the Stewards following the running of the fifth to explain why **UNIFORM RUBY** was withdrawn at the start. The jockey had requested that the saddle be reset when arriving at the start as it had ridden up, resulting in the saddle slipping off the horse, which then flatly refused to be retacked. The Stewards noted this explanation and took no further action.
